Keynote Speaker, Dr. Kenneth David Jackson

Is a professor of Luso-Brazilian literature at Yale University, with a special research interest in Portuguese literature and culture in Asia. His research in Goa, supported by the American Institute of Indian Studies, was conducted at the Xavier Centre for Historical Research. Prof Jackson is an academic member of the Academia de Marinha (Lisbon) and the Academia Portuguesa de História (Lisbon) and a recipient of the Vasco da Gama Medal (Portugal) and the Ordem de Rio Branco (Brazil).

Keynote address title: Goan Studies in International Perspective

Jonardon Ganeri

Is the Bimal. K. Matilal Distinguished Professor of Philosophy at the University of Toronto. He is a philosopher whose work draws on various philosophical traditions to construct new positions in the philosophy of mind, metaphysics and epistemology. His latest book, Fernando Pessoa: Imagination and the Self (OUP 2024), brings the ideas of the Portuguese poet into dialogue with Indian philosophical poetics.

Rosa Maria Perez

Is an anthropologist and senior researcher at the Centre for Research in Anthropology (CRIA). Until August 2020, she was a professor at the Department of Anthropology of ISCTE- University Institute of Lisbon. She has been a visiting professor at different universities in the USA (notably Brown University), Europe, Mozambique, Brazil and India. Her core research is on Indian society and social segregation (focusing on Dalits and women), women studies, colonialism and postcolonialism in India, fieldwork methodology, public anthropology and human rights.

Presentation Title: Goa Beyond the Portuguese Gaze: An Anthropological Approach

Irène Silveira Almeida

Is an Assistant Professor in the Discipline of French and Francophone Studies at Goa University. Her doctoral work studied integration in the context of the Goan-French diaspora. Her interdisciplinary research work draws from diverse domains such as Diaspora and Culture Studies, Sociolinguistics, French and Francophone Literature, Teaching Methodology, Goa Studies, and Historical Representations.

PhD (History), University of Goa, Retired as Assistant State Librarian, State Central Library, Goa. She holds a Master's in History and a Master's in Library and Information Science. She has published seven books and presented papers at national and international conferences, many of which were published as proceedings of the Conference. She has contributed to academic journals and regularly to various periodicals and newspapers.

Edward S. Cooke, Jr.

The Charles F. Montgomery Professor of American Decorative Arts in the History of Art Department at Yale University, focuses on material culture and decorative arts, especially from the 16th century to the present. At Yale, Cooke teaches lecture courses on American material culture from the fifteenth century to the present as well as an introductory course on global decorative arts and offers seminars on a variety of topics, including material culture theory, embodied artisanal knowledge, the American interior, American furniture, and modern craft.

Her publications include Singing Gandhi's India Music and Sonic Nationalism (Roli Books, 2020) and The Sovereign and the Pirate: ordering India's Maritime Subjects in India's Western Littoral (O.U.P. Delhi, 2016).

Has worked as a teacher at various levels (school, college and university) for about half a century, and teaching has been not only a career but a passion and a blessing. Isabel did her PhD on Theatre in Asia in the Twentieth Century. She is one of the founding members of The Mustard Seed Art Company, Goa, an amateur theatre group that has been doing theatre for the last 38 years. She translated the play Sem Flores Nem Coroas by Orlando da Costa from Portuguese to English in 2017.

Nalini Elvino de Sousa

Is an ethnomusicologist specializing in the music associated with Goan theatre. Born in Portugal, she moved to Goa over 25 years ago. She is actively involved in various education-related projects and music and their dissemination through different media. Nalini has directed, anchored, and produced documentaries for RTPi – Portuguese International Television and short films under the banner of Lotus Film & TV Production.





Alinto Coelho

Is not just a civil engineer with over three decades of expertise—he is a storyteller of Goa's architectural soul. With an unwavering passion for preserving the region's rich history. Alinto has personally chronicled the beauty and essence of over 200 traditional Goan homes, ensuring their stories endure for generations. Beyond his engineering acumen, Alinto's passion shines through his written works, with regular contributions to international publications like The Goan Association Quarterly Bulletin (New Jersey, USA) and The Global Goan (Australia).

Sachin Chatte

Is a film critic residing in Goa, with a career in film criticism spanning three decades, beginning in 1993. Since 1998, he has been a film critic with The Navhind Times, Goa, and has contributed to numerous other publications. He is a member of FIPRESCI (International Federation of Film Critics) and, in addition to his role as a critic, he curates films for the Cinephile Film Club under the Entertainment Society of Goa and has participated in various juries.

Her research interests also extend to Sociolinguistics and Translation studies, where she actively engages in exploring language dynamics and cross- cultural communication.

Hugo C. Cardoso is Associate Professor of Linguistics at the University of Lisbon, having earlier worked in Macau, Hong Kong, and Coimbra. He researches language contact, with a particular focus on the Portugueselexified creole languages of South Asia (India and Sri Lanka) and a secondary one on those of Insular Southeast Asia. His research combines a synchronic (descriptive) perspective with an interest in the history of these languages and comparative approaches.

Fr. (Dr.) Eufemiano Miranda de Jesus Miranda has a formation in the classics from the Seminaries of Saligao and Rachol. After obtaining his M.A., he taught Portuguese and English at St. Xavier's college, Mapusa. He did his PhD at Goa University on the Topic "19th -20th-century Indo-Portugues Literature- a study of Major themes in the socio-historical background", which was published under the auspices of the Department of Art and Culture, Government of Goa, bearing the title 'Oriente e Ocidente na literatura Goesa- East and West in Goan Literature'

Ms. Sheela Jaywant

Sheela Jaywant Was born and educated in Bombay and currently lives in Sangolda, Goa. She has been writing regularly since 1983. She wrote a weekly humour column for nearly twenty years for two local papers and continues to write for Goa Today. She has translated books from Marathi to English. Her most recent book, The First Book of Indlish Poems, was published in 2022. She has been a prize-winner, on the jury and editor of The Fundação Oriente Short Story Competition(s) at various times.





Mr. Madhav Borkar

Madhav Borkar did his M.A. in English and Aesthetics. He writes in Konkani, Marathi and English. He has nine collections of poems to his credit. He received the Sahitya Akademi Prize in 2001 for his collection of poems titled "Yaman". Besides this, he has also translated poems of Rabindranath Tagore into Konkani. Borcar joined All India Radio in 1984 and retired as Indian Broadcasting Service (IBS) officer in 2014.

Dr. Anil Kumar Yadav

Dr. Anil Kumar Yadav is a scholar and translator specializing in Indo-Portuguese language and literature. His PhD, funded by Camões IP, was completed under the supervision of Professor Maria Luísa Malato (FLUP, University of Porto), Prof. Rajiv Saxena (Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi), and Prof. Delfim Correia da Silva, Director Camões, I.P. Goa. His research, "The Philosophical Elements of the Buddhist and Vedic Tradition in the Work of Portuguese Writer Fernando Pessoa", was successfully defended and awarded in 2023. Dr. Anil has translated notable works, including José Luís Peixoto's 'Morreste-me' (Portuguese to Hindi) and 'Retratos Luso-Asiáticos da Índia' into Hindi.

Damodar Mauzo, who lives in a coastal village of South Goa, is a short fiction writer and a novelist writing in Konkani. He is the recipient of the Jnanpith Award (2022). He has won many other awards, including the Sahitya Akademi Award (1983). He is also a columnist, translator, critic and scriptwriter. He is the most translated author of Konkani. His collection of stories, Teresa's Man and Other Stories, was nominated for the prestigious Frank O'Connor International Prize. His books have been finalists for many National awards, including the Crossword Prize 2024. So far, he has about 30 fiction books besides his edited and translated works. He also has a book, Ink of Dissent, a collection of essays originally written in English.

Sharmila Pais is an Associate Professor at the Department of History, St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, Goa. She was awarded a doctorate for research on Electoral Studies in Colonial Goa. She has authored 'The Encounter with the Ballot in Colonial Goa', co-authored 'The Quest for Goa' and edited 'The Folk Stories of Goa' (November 2024). She Structured a fewchapters for the 12th Std History textbook curriculum in 2024. She has presented research papers at state, national and international conferences. Her works have been featured in international publications. Currently, she is pursuing further research into the colonial history of Goa.

She has written for Konkani dailies Sunprant and Bhangarbhui, and her articles have been aired on All India Radio. She is the editor and compiler of children's stories 'Kanyanachi Gathan', published in 2006; author of 'Chanuchyo Kanyo', stories written for children published in 2012 and translated 'Nirbhudhicho Rajkarbar', a collection of stories for children for Sahitya Akademi in 2015. She translates children's stories from other languages for Prathambooks Storyweaver and NBT. Her main areas of interest are Language teaching and translation.

Inês Forjaz de Lacerda is a PhD candidate in the Department of Spanish and Portuguese at Yale University. Her research explores the connections between the Portuguese-speaking world and Asia from the early modern era to the present. Her dissertation, 'The Shadow Empire: Women Writing Portuguese Asia', examines how women's writing reconfigures the remnants of Portugal's colonial empire, highlighting narratives that challenge a singular, linear understanding of imperial collapse. Inês holds a B.A. in English and Comparative World Literature from Kenyon College (2017) and an M.A. in Comparative Studies from the University of Lisbon (2020).
