The Fox International Fellowship is a graduate student exchange program between Yale University and 20 world-renowned academic partners in Africa, Asia, Australia, Europe, the Middle East, and the Americas. There are more than 700 alumni in the extensive Fox Fellowship network.

Our Mission

The mission of the Fox International Fellowship is to enhance mutual understanding between the peoples of the United States and other countries by promoting international scholarly exchanges and collaborations among the next generation of leaders. To accomplish this goal, the program seeks to identify and nurture those students who are interested in harnessing scholarly knowledge to respond to the world's most pressing challenges.



History & Expansion

Established in 1988 by Joseph Carrère Fox, Yale '38, with the vision to "promote international education as a pathway to global peace and stability."

Initial Partnership: First partnered with Moscow State University.

Research

Conduct independent projects that contribute to academic knowledge and address real-world issues.



Engagement

Actively participate in the academic and social life of partner universities, enhancing the fellowship experience.



Networking

Forge connections with local researchers, academic communities, and organizations to broaden their impact.



Support for **Outgoing Fellows**

Resources

Access to university faculty, extensive library systems, and archival collections.

Engagement Activities

Opportunities to participate in classes, workshops, and cultural events at host institutions.

Community **Integration**

Inclusion in the Fox alumni network. offering ongoing support and connections.





Financial Support

Includes a monthly stipend to cover living expenses, round-trip economy-class airfare, health insurance through ISOS, and a research grant of up to \$2,000 to support projectrelated expenses.




Eligibility



Who Can Apply?

- Graduate students (doctoral and master's) currently enrolled at Yale.
- Outstanding graduating seniors demonstrating exceptional academic achievement.





Language Proficiency

For Berlin, Istanbul, Mexico City, Paris, São Paulo, Buenos Aires, Shanghai, and Tokyo students must demonstrate sufficient language (at least Intermediate Level) proficiency.

Additional Criteria

- Doctoral candidates should have completed all coursework.
- Master's students must obtain administrative approval for coursework interruption.
- Not open to students proposing projects in their home country.



Application Process

How to Apply:

Applications must be submitted online via the Student Grants and Fellowships Database.

Required Application Materials:

- Research proposal relevant to the partner institution (1200 words).
- <u>Leadership statement</u> detailing past experiences and aspirations (450 words).
- <u>Curriculum vitae (CV)</u> highlighting academic and professional achievements.
- Two letters of recommendation from faculty or professionals attesting to the applicant's qualifications.

Application Deadline:

Friday, February 13, 2026, at 1:00 PM





Selection Process

Selection Committee:

An interdisciplinary faculty committee evaluates all applications.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Quality of Research Proposal: Originality and significance of the proposed project.
- Academic Achievement: Record of scholarly performance.
- Personal Character and Leadership
 Potential: Demonstrated commitment to service and community engagement.
- Language Proficiency: Required for specific host countries.
- Relevance of Host University: Alignment with your research goals and availability of resources.

Friday, February 13, 2026, at 1:00 PM

Fellowship Period:


9 to 12 months, beginning in late August or at the start of the academic year.
